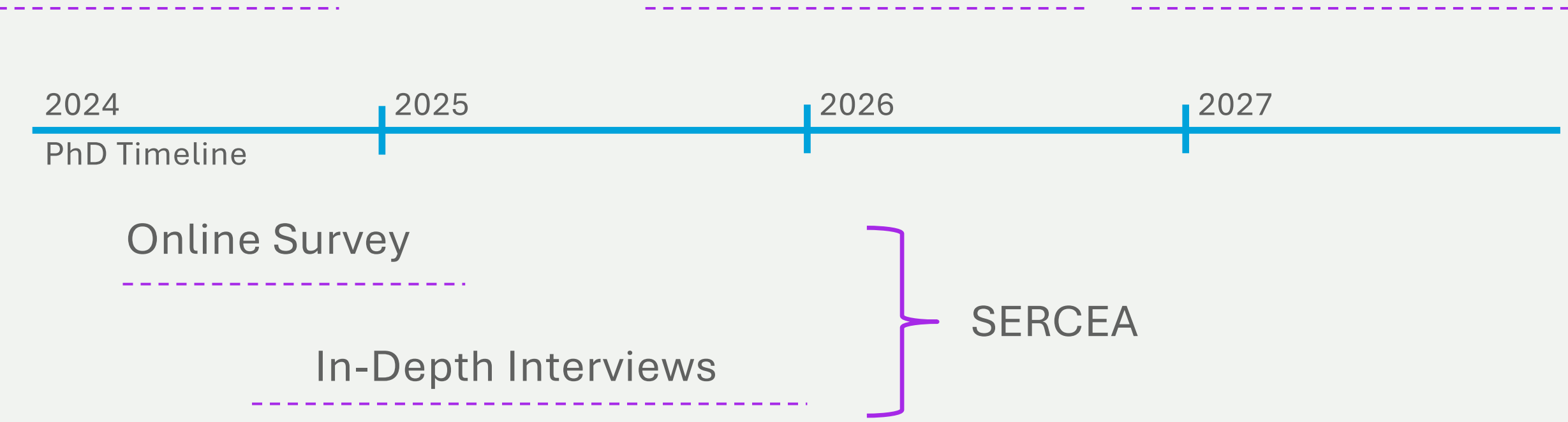

In-Depth Interviews

Aim: Insight in content and implementation of a RI CoC

- Semi Structured with Interview Guide
- +/- 60-90 minutes
- Online (Microsoft Teams)
- Target population: Research Regulators and Research Ethics committee members
- Analysis in MAXQDA software
- Deductive and Inductive Coding

Questions

1. How to define the scope of the in-depth interviews – since RI is such a large topic, I’m struggling with confining the scope of the interviews and balancing broadness while also going in-depth in the interviews.
2. How to best determine the number of participants? We will stratify per country and will have multiple sub-groups within those strata.
3. How can I best ask for context-specific insights? We are doing this study to create a context specific RI Code of Conduct, so there is quite a chance that I’m not aware of those context specific insights.
